However exchange students are free to take the courses as per their university’s requirements.Double degree students are required to take full work-load as per our existing rules.

Visa Information	Exchange students need a “Student Visa” for studying in India. As per Government of India rules, enrolment for academic programme with a tourist visa is strictly prohibited. If any candidate from our partner institutes arrives with a tourist visa, he/she will not be enrolled in our PGP programme.
Accommodation (On-Campus)	All incoming exchange students are provided with single-occupancy furnished rooms with combined toilet & bath in our PGP students’ hostel. A tariff of 200 Euros per term will be charged for this accommodation.
Student Mess	The student mess is managed by the student community. A monthly expense of INR 3,000/- is sufficient for a student to meet the mess expenses.
The Student Exchange Cell	<p>A Student Exchange Committee has been specially set up to work in unison with the Student Exchange Programme Office, to forge new alliances with the premier management institutes all over the world. It also aids in facilitating passage of IIML students to foreign universities. The Cell works closely with the Corporate community in structuring project partnerships for the outbound students.</p> <p>The Exchange Cell makes sure that the exchange students have absolutely no trouble from the time they land in Lucknow. The Cell has a full-fledged program to induct exchange students into the IIM L community. The students are provided information on the courses that would best suit their requirements, they are shown around the campus, and around Lucknow.</p> <p>The Student Exchange Cell of IIM Lucknow organizes numerous events throughout the year to provide our exchange students a rich cultural experience. Our flagship event is the Student Exchange Cultural Nite with performances from the exchange students.</p>
Other facilities	<p>IIML boasts state-of-the art facilities. It has about 10 amphitheatres seating 60+ students. All are air-conditioned, and provide standard teaching aids, such as blackboard, overhead projector, computer, Internet and multimedia tools.</p> <p>Library: Housed in a spacious 30000 sq. ft. air-conditioned building with a seating capacity of 250 readers in five halls and equipped with ergonomically designed furniture and fittings, the library acts as a main learning resource center of the institute. The collection ranges from standard textbooks to international journals and magazines, complemented by some classic business fiction and light reading material. An organized database and an efficient cataloguing system ensure speedy access to the appropriate content required. The reading room is open 24 hours every day.</p> <p>Computer Centre: The computer center has about 200 PCs, with round-the-clock access to the Internet. The computing resources available here match that of any institute in the world. The whole institute, including the hostels, is well networked through the LAN.</p> <p>Sports: A plethora of sports facilities are available on campus. These include a Football and Cricket field; Basketball, Volleyball, Tennis and Badminton courts; and an indoor recreation hall for Badminton and Table Tennis. A state of the art swimming pool and a Gymnasium with modern equipment has recently been set up.</p> <p>Medical Facilities: Inside the campus, the medical center serves as a hub for basic health-care. The Medical Center is equipped with basic diagnostic equipment and has physicians working round the clock. In case of emergencies, there is an ambulance to transfer the patient to hospitals staffed with specialists and sophisticated equipment.</p>

	<p>On-Campus shopping: The commercial plaza has stores, which offer basic necessities such as stationery items, snacks, photocopiers, postal services, banking services etc. The community center has telephone booths to place local and international calls. For further shopping requirements, the student can visit Hazratganj, Aminabad and other major shopping areas in the city.</p> <p>Transportation: Train services connect the city with the metros and tourist hotspots. Traveling in Indian trains is an experience by itself – there is hardly a better way to explore the country. There are daily flights to and from Delhi, Calcutta, Mumbai, Bangalore and other cities. Airfares are in the range of \$160 (round trip LKO-Delhi) and above. Reservations can be made through the Indian Railways or airlines offices directly or through the local representative of the UP Tourism Office.</p>										
Getting Here	<p>By Air: Amausi Airport is 31 Kms from IIML Campus. Daily flights to Mumbai, Delhi, Calcutta, Chennai and various International flights are available. Pre-paid taxis coinciding with flight timings are available from the airport.</p> <p>By Rail: North & North-Eastern Railways connects Lucknow (Charbagh) by express and superfast trains. Charbagh railway station is 21 Kms from IIML Campus.</p>										
Other important information for incoming exchange students	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All exchange students should ensure that they are in the campus on or before the course registration day. The course registration will be held at the PGP block, thereon they will be governed by the PGP rules at par with the regular students of IIM Lucknow. • All exchange students need to intimate their return travel plan to the Student Exchange Office well in advance. In case of emergency wherein a student needs to leave before completing the term then communication from the partner institute will be required for relieving the student.
