RECRUITMENT OF PROBATIONARY CLERKS - PROJECT- 2012-13.

Vijaya Bank, one of the Fast Growing Public Sector Banks, with Head Office at Bangalore, having a network of 1300 plus branches and offices, with total employee strength of around 12000 with presence all over India, invites applications (On-Line only) from young & Dynamic Candidates who have qualified in the Common Written Examination (CWE)- for Clerk-conducted by Institute of Banking Personnel Selection (IBPS) in the year 2011 and holding a valid score card issued by IBPS, for recruitment for the posts of Probationary Clerks.

1. NAME OF THE POST / NO. OF VACANCIES:

Table with columns: Post Code, Name of the Post, No. of Vacancies, Age as on 01.08.2011. Shows Probationary Clerk with 800 vacancies.

No. of vacancies is provisional and may vary according to the actual requirements of the Bank. The Bank also reserves the right to increase or decrease the number of vacancy/ies based on various factors/administrative requirements/reasons and shall also cancel the vacancies advertised for recruitment, without assigning any reason.

2. PAY SCALE, ALLOWANCES AND PERQUISITES

Table with columns: Post, Pay Scale (Rs.), Approximate total monthly emoluments inclusive of Basic, DA, CCA, HRA etc., at the start of the scale at metropolitan centres.

@ In addition, clerks are also eligible for Leave encashment & LFC encashment in lieu of LFC, Reimbursement of Conveyance, Medical Aid, Hospitalization expenses, Retirement benefits, Loans at concessional rates as per the rules of the Bank. They are eligible for liberal welfare schemes & benefits.

3. THE STATEWISE VACANCIES, RESERVATION TO SCHEDULED CASTE, SCHEDULED TRIBE, OTHER BACKWARD CLASSES, PWD & XSM UNDER:

Large table showing State/Union Territory Code No., State/Union Territory, Total No of Vacancies, Category-wise Apportionment of Vacancies (SC, ST, OBC, GEN, TOTAL), PWD (OC, HI, VC), and XSM.

\* Including Backlog Vacancies.

(i) The recruitment for the post of Probationary Clerks is on State-wise / Union territory-wise basis. Candidates can apply for Probationary Clerk post in ONE STATE / UNION TERRITORY ONLY and should have appeared for the CWE, from a centre allotted for that particular State / Union Territory in IBPS CWE-CLERK 2011. On selection, candidates will be placed anywhere in that state / union territory depending up on Bank's requirement.

(ii) Candidates should be able to read, write and speak English.

(iii) Candidates should possess proficiency in the official language of the State/ UT (ability to read, write and speak local/State language) in which they have appeared for the Common Written Examination (CWE-CLERK 2011) and in which they have qualified.

The reservation for Persons with disabilities (PWD) and Ex-Servicemen (XSM) is on horizontal basis. The selected candidates will be placed in the appropriate category (viz., SC, ST, OBC, GEN etc.) to which they belong.

Reservations are followed strictly as per Government Guidelines. The number of vacancies and also the number of reserved vacancies is provisional and may vary according to actual requirement of the Bank.

In case of non-availability of reserved candidates in Persons with disabilities (PWD) category, Bank reserves its right to inter-change these sub-categories as per Government Directives.

It is clarified that it may not be possible to employ Persons With Disabilities in all Offices/Branches of the Bank and they will have to work in the post identified by the Bank as suitable for them.

Abbreviations stand for:

SC - Scheduled Caste; ST - Scheduled Tribe; OBC - Other Backward Classes; GEN (General-Unreserved); XSM - Ex-Serviceman; PWD - Person With Disability OC - Orthopaedically Challenged, HI - Hearing Impaired, VC - Visually Challenged.

Definition of Ex-Servicemen (XSM):

i. Ex-Servicemen(XSM): Only those candidates shall be treated as Ex-servicemen who fulfill the revised definition as laid down in Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, Department of Personnel & Administrative Reforms Notification No.36034/5/85 Estt. (SCT) dated 27.01.1986 as amended from time to time.

ii. Disabled Ex-Servicemen(DISXS): Ex-servicemen who while serving in Armed Forces of the union were disabled in operation against the enemy or in disturbed areas shall be treated as DISXS.

iii. Dependents of Ex-Servicemen Killed In Action (DXS): Servicemen killed in the following operations would be deemed to have been killed in action attributable to military service (a) war (b) war like operations or Border skirmishes either with Pakistan on cease fire line or any other country (c) fighting against armed hostiles in a counter insurgency environment viz

Nagaland, Mirzoram, etc. (d) serving with peace keeping mission abroad (e) laying or clearance of mines including enemy mines as also mine sweeping operation between one month before and three months after conclusion of an operation (f) frost bite during actual operations or during the period specified by the Government (g) dealing with agitating para-military forces personnel (h) IPKF Personnel killed during the operations in Sri Lanka.

The definitions of VC, HI, OC are as prescribed in "The Persons with Disabilities (Equal opportunities protection of Rights & full participation) Act 1995".

- 1. Locomotor Disability or Cerebral Palsy (OC) - Persons who have a minimum of 40% of physical defect or deformity which causes an interference with the normal functioning of the bones, muscles and joints.
2. Hearing Impairment (HI) - Those in whom the sense of hearing is non-functional for ordinary purposes of life, i.e., those who do not hear, understand sounds at all, even with amplified speech.
3. Visually Challenged (VC) (Blindness or Low Vision) - Refers to a person who suffers from any of the following conditions: a) Total absence of sight. b) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses, or c) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse and so certified by a Medical Board appointed by the State Government.

Candidates belonging to reserved category including Persons With Disability & Ex-Servicemen, for which no reservation has been announced, are free to apply for vacancies announced for unreserved category, however they must fulfill all the eligibility conditions of unreserved Category.

4. RELAXATION IN UPPER AGE LIMIT:

Table with columns: SN, Category, Age relaxation. Lists various categories like Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe, Other Backward Classes, PWD, Ex-serviceman, etc. with their respective age relaxations.

Note:

- a) An Ex-Serviceman who has once joined a government job on the civil side after availing the benefits given to him as an Ex-Serviceman for his re-employment, including a job in Public Sector Undertaking, ceases to enjoy ex-serviceman status for further employment.
b) Relaxation in upper age limit available to SC/ST/OBC candidates is allowed on cumulative basis with only one of the remaining categories for which age relaxation is permitted as mentioned above.
c) All persons eligible for age relaxation under Serial no. (5) above must produce the domicile certificate at the time of interview from the District Magistrate in the Kashmir Division within whose jurisdiction he/she had ordinarily resided or any other authority designated in this regard by Govt. of J & K to the effect that the candidate had ordinarily been domiciled in the Kashmir Division of the State of J & K during 1st January, 1980 and the 31st December, 1989.
d) All persons eligible for age relaxation under serial no. (7) above must possess a certificate from the Competent Authority to the effect that their father/mother/family member died in the 1984 riots.

e) Candidates seeking other age relaxation/s will be required to submit copies of necessary certificate(s) at the time of interview.

5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

5.1 NATIONALITY / CITIZENSHIP:

A candidate must be either (i) a citizen of India or (ii) a subject of Nepal or (iii) a subject of Bhutan or (iv) a Tibetan Refugee who came over to India before 1st Jan. 1962 with the intention of permanently settling in India or (v) a person of Indian origin who has migrated from Pakistan, Burma, Sri Lanka, East African countries of Kenya, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania (formerly Tanganyika and Zanzibar), Zambia, Malawi, Zaire, Ethiopia and Vietnam with the intention of permanently settling in India, provided that a candidate belonging to categories (ii), (iii), (iv) & (v) above shall be a person in whose favour a certificate of eligibility has been issued by the Govt. of India. A candidate in whose case a certificate of eligibility is necessary may be admitted to the examination/interview conducted by the IBPS/Bank but on final selection the offer of appointment may be given only after the necessary eligibility certificate has been issued to him by the Govt. of India.

5.2 EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS as on 01.08.2011:

Candidates must possess the requisite qualifications as on 01.08.2011. A pass with 60% marks in the aggregate in Matriculation/SSC (old pattern)/SSLC/10th Std. Examination of 10+2+3 pattern or equivalent. For SC/ST/OBC/PWD/XSM candidates, a pass in the aggregate in Matriculation/SSC (old pattern)/SSLC/10th Std. Examination of 10+2+3 pattern or equivalent

OR A pass with 50% marks in HSC examination of 10+2 (10+2+3 pattern)/ 11th Std. of 11+1+3 pattern or Intermediate/ Pre-University or any equivalent examination/ Diploma in Banking recognized by Central/ State Government or U.T. administration. For SC/ST/OBC/PWD/XSM candidates, a pass in HSC examination of 10+2 (10+2+3 pattern)/ 11th Std. of (11+1+3) pattern or Intermediate/ Pre-University or any equivalent examination/ Diploma in Banking recognized by Central/ State Government or U.T. administration.

OR Degree in any discipline from a recognized University or any equivalent qualification recognized as such by the Central Government.

The Educational Qualifications prescribed for the post are the minimum requirements for eligibility. Candidates with higher qualification will have added advantage. Preference will be given to computer literate (proficient in MS Office Basic Applications).

Degrees obtained from the recognized Universities/Institutes recognized by the Govt. of India only will be considered. Candidates must specifically indicate the class / division and percentage of marks obtained calculated to the nearest two decimals in the relevant column of the online application. Where no percentage of marks is awarded by the University, but only Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)/ Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) is awarded, the same should be converted into percentage, besides indicating the CGPA/OGPA in the online application.

- 1. Candidates should have appeared for CWE for Clerical cadre held in 2011 from a centre in a State/UT for which vacancies he/she wishes to apply.
2. Should be able to read, write and speak English.
3. Should possess proficiency in the official language of the State/ UT (ability to read, write and speak local/State language) in which they have appeared for the Common Written Examination (CWE-CLERK 2011) and in which they have qualified

5.3.a. IBPS CWE-CLERK 2011 Score - Statewise/category wise Minimum Cut-Off Marks
