## Faculty Overview

The curriculum combines foundational and advanced training in legal studies relevant for international legal practice and intellectual engagements. The course offers students extensive opportunities to develop an international perspective in various areas of law while giving sufficient focus to issues in play in the South Asian region of the world. The academic training is aimed to create a new generation of lawyers from the region equipped with legal expertise for international legal practice, academic research and other intellectually demanding roles.

LLM program at SAU is a two year, full time, taught degree course. The program includes a range of compulsory and optional credit courses taught by outstanding faculty from the region, scholarly lecture series of international jurists and lawyers and academic engagements through conferences and seminars.

Students are assessed at the end of each semester on a variety of parameters decided by the concerned course instructor. Assessment is made on the basis of timed or take home examination conducted twice a semester, a term paper and an oral presentation. Each assessment is marked on a grade point average (GPA). The LLM degree is awarded on the successful completion of 64 credit courses followed by a supervised dissertation.

## Academic Approach

Legal study at South Asian University aims at an analytical understanding of the subjects, systems, theories and institutions in the field of International Law. It is widely believed that international law today has become the common language of relations between states. The Programme is sensitive to the perspective of South Asian countries and firmly believes that SAARC nations through this programme would be able to explore new areas of cooperation and commitment.

Apart from traditional methods of pedagogy, the Faculty adopts seminar methods, where weekly legal discourses are organized and eminent law scholars from India and abroad are invited to interact with faculty and students. The Faculty also organizes discussions on contemporary legal problems, through joint seminars with other institutions.

The Faculty of Legal Studies intends to engage the available human resources in the region and other parts of the world to contribute towards establishing centres of excellence in the field of international law and other important fields of law.

## Outline of Programmes

The Faculty of Legal Studies emphasises on developing an interdisciplinary approach to the study of International Law. The compulsory courses offered at Faculty of Legal Studies are : General Principles of International Law, International Trade Law, Law of International Organisations, International Human Rights Law, International Humanitarian Law, International Criminal Law, Law of the Sea, Private International Law, Intellectual Property Law, Legal Theory and Jurisprudence. The Faculty offers some innovative courses such as Comparative Constitutional Law of South Asian countries.

Among the optional papers offered at the Department are : Comparative and International Competition Law, Air and Space Law, Intellectual Property Law, International Petroleum Law, Law of the Sea-South Asian perspective, International Dispute Settlement, Alternate Dispute Resolution, Taxation Laws, Comparative Corporate Laws, Law, Governance & Development in South Asia, International Commercial, Arbitration, Maritime Law, Business Law in SAARC Countries, Principles of Conflict of Laws, Cyber Law and Cyber Crime, Mergers and Acquisitions, International Refugee Law, Biomedical Laws and Ethics, International Human Rights Law.

## Admission, Evaluation and Grading System

The students holding citizenship of any of the SAARC nation are admitted after qualifying a rigorous common entrance examination held annually in eight SAARC nations simultaneously. Parity in students' representation from SAARC nations is ensured by following a country-wise quota system for admission. Students from non-SAARC nations are admitted on the basis of merit and past academic record, ten percent of seats being reserved for them.

At SAU students are evaluated on a scale of nine point grading system using a cumulative grade point average system (CGPA). The evaluation is based on a series of periodic tests, semester examinations; take home assignments, research projects and class presentations conducted throughout the semester followed by a supervised dissertation.

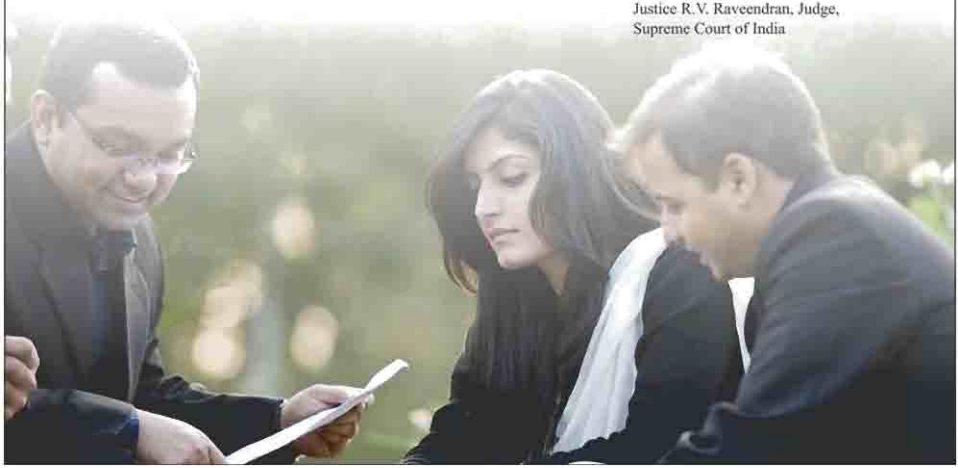

## Placement Process

### CAMPUS RECRUITMENT GUIDELINES 2013

The SAU Placement committee is a student driven body authorised and responsible for communicating and coordinating between LL.M students applying for recruitment and the Prospective employers. The guidelines for campus recruitment have been formulated to ensure flexibility and fairness in the recruitment process. The recruitment process devised by the Faculty of Legal Studies student placement committee follows a three stage process.

#### Step 1

The process is initiated with the interested Organizations/prospective employers giving a pre-placement talk (PPT) to interested students at the University or sending/emailing brochures, power point slides etc in lieu of the first, containing important information such as the profile of the organisation, career prospects, terms and conditions for employment and compensation package. This offers a firsthand interaction between the students and the prospective employer.

#### Step 2

The second part of the recruitment is the on-campus recruitment which takes place during the mentioned recruitment days. Any organisation who may or may not have made a PPT are invited to participate in the on-campus recruitment process after informing and registering with the placement committee. In this regard, interested organizations are requested to contact the placement committee directly at the mailing address provided. .

#### Step 3

The third stage gives liberty to the prospective employer to follow its own recruitment procedure, invite vetted resumes for short listing for interviews and final selection. Whatever be the mode of selection, interested organisations /prospective employers are requested to notify the placement committee pre-hand for the purpose of avoiding any miscommunication and delay. The interviews can be conducted on-campus, telephonic, video conferencing or whatever mode is found suitable. The recruiters are interested not to encourage any personal communication made by the candidate whose applications they have received through the placement committee.
